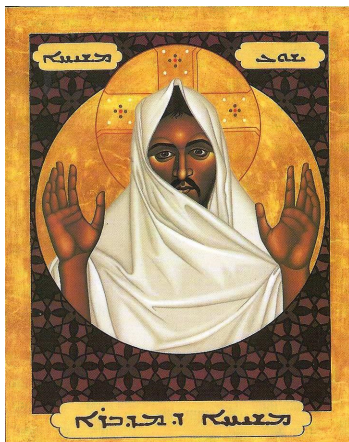

An Easter Experience

In this season of increasing light and lengthening days, the Aramaic Prayer of Jesus is a deep attunement to the Christ-Light. In the Western world, this prayer – known as the “Lord’s Prayer” - came to us through Jesus’ words that were first written in Greek and then translated into many western languages as “Our Father which art in heaven....” However, when the prayer is translated from Jesus’ original language, Aramaic, directly into English, an even more powerful message of radiant love emerges. This view of Jesus’ words is the work of Dr. Neil Douglas-Klotz, Aramaic scholar and author of “Prayers of the Cosmos: Meditations on the Aramaic Words of Jesus.”

We will experience - through sound and movement - a rich tapestry of meaning that is both mystical and practical, using simple melodies and circle dance movements known as "body prayers," an ancient Middle Eastern form of meditation that engages the entire body in contemplation of scripture. Set in the tradition of the Dances of Universal Peace, these dances and words are easily learned and fully participatory to all who join the circle. The sense of community and peace that we achieve through the Prayer is then sent out for the benefit of all beings everywhere and for peace on Earth. No prior experience needed; all dances are taught in the moment.
